Welcome To Eneabba The humble beginnings of Brooks Hire Service

In 1970, at the tender age of 15, and with humble dreams of becoming an apprentice mechanic, Doug Brooks decided to venture out into the big wide world by himself. In 2020, he celebrated the 40th Anniversary of his nation-wide business, Brooks Hire Service. This is how a country boy from Katanning built a business empire from nothing but the shirt on his back.

Douglas Brooks started his working life on a farm in Pingrup, working seven days a week for a meagre \$13 pay cheque. With dreams of securing an apprenticeship in a mechanical trade, he decided to hitchhike to Bunbury where he found accommodation in a boarding house in Haig Street. After two weeks he was still unsuccessful in securing a job. Relaying his disappointment to a couple of surveyors who were boarding there, they encouraged him to try his luck in Perth. Now, Doug's mother had told him that Perth was 'a rough place' so he was hesitant to leave, but the surveyors reassured the young lad with a "you'll be right mate," and convinced him to travel with them the following day.

Upon arriving in Perth, Doug spent the weekend with some extended family members who lived in Balga. Not wanting to overstay his welcome, he hit the road in search of alternative accommodation. He began towards Perth until, at around 10pm, he saw a very appealing bus stop bench where he decided to bunker down for the night. At around 1am, after a couple of hours of broken sleep, he was awoken by a young lady hanging from the window of a passing car who yelled at him, "Hey ya f***ing wanker!". "Jesus, Mum's right, this is a rough place," thought Doug who decided to move on.

he heard the relieving sound of an open caravan door swinging in the breeze. Separating him from a potential good night sleep, was a cyclone fence with three rows of barbed wire. "I can do that," he thought, and after scaling the fence Doug ventured inside the van, gave himself a guick wash and was soon sound asleep. As dawn broke the next morning, Doug awoke to the sound of early morning traffic on Wanneroo Road and thought he better make tracks. He peered out the caravan to make his dash, only to cast his eyes upon a large German Shepard guard dog casing out the van. Doug decide to wait another 10 - 15 minutes until the dog walked towards the other end of the yard. With a 20 metre head start, Doug

opened the caravan door and bolted to the fence with the German

Shepherd in hot pursuit. He barely made it to safety with the dog

snapping viciously on the other side of the ring-lock fence. This

was a real guard dog and he wasn't happy at all. Doug tried telling

him he was a good dog, but he was not having a bar of it. This was

the start of Doug's adventures in Perth.

Twenty minutes later Doug came across a caravan hire yard where

Doug went on to find an apprenticeship at Tim's Motors on Scarborough Beach Road. At the time, he was earning \$16 per week as a first-year apprentice and paying \$10 per week repayments on a blue panel van. This left Doug with limited options for accommodation, so it was a no brainer to live in the car. As a second-year apprentice, his wage increased to \$22 per week, and it was during these tough years that Doug learned to budget. Those skills have come in handy with business.

When Tim's Motors lost a major contract with Sadliers, Doug found himself retrenched and in search of another job. He shortlisted Major Motors as a place he'd like to work so he plucked up the courage to go in and ask for a job. There he met a fellow by the name of Tony Morrey who told him, "Doug, if you haven't got a job

in two weeks, come back and see us." Recognising a break when he saw one, Doug came out of there as happy as Larry and went surfing for two weeks. He came back two weeks later and said, "Tony, I haven't got a job," and that's how he got his first break. At this time, Doug




was still living in his panel van and was always the first in to work in in the morning. The other guys couldn't work it out, how was Brooksy always the first one in? The truth was, he'd pull into the parking lot at 10pm, get the best parking spot and sleep there.



After about 6 months of this, management worked out what was going on and did a call around to see if anyone could offer the lad a bed. He ended up living in one of the mechanic's sheds for a while, and when his son moved out of home, he got offered the son's bedroom.

After finishing his apprenticeship with Major Motors, Doug took a position with Air Drill. It was here that he learned a bit about air compressors and hence, the first machine that he purchased was an air compressor. By this time Doug was working on Barrow Island for WAPET. With no business experience but plenty of ambition, Doug scrounged together every dollar he had to purchase two disassembled compressors, with the remainder of the bill being settled by bankcard.



This was the beginning of Brooks Hire. After paying off the aircompressors, Doug decided to leave Barrow Island and run his business from a shed in Eneabba.



What started out as 2 compressors, soon turned into 12 pumps on hire, then an 8T crane was purchased. At the time, Doug didn't have



the \$500 needed to freight the crane from Perth to Eneabba so he drove it 13 hours to get it there himself. Along the way he noticed the crane was starting to go off course and was heading towards and oncoming truck. He reefed the crane to the side and took his foot off the accelerator at the same

time not realising that he'd lose steering, so he ran off the road.

Lesson learned, he didn't do that again!

Doug was living in a humpy at the back of the shed with his little dog for company. He was working long hours during the week, and driving to Perth on the weekend for parts. It was during one of these trips that he met Roma, his future wife.





With the business continuing to grow, Brooks Hire set up shop in Hogarth Street, Cannington and hired their first apprentice. It wasn't too long before they purchased their own yard in Canning Vale, where they are still located today. The yard was a blank canvas and Doug

purpose built the infrastructure to accommodate his growing business. The rest, as they say, is history.

We've created this division to strengthen our transport service for our hire customers, and also to create opportunities for growth in the transport industry. Our trucks will not only be used to transport our own machines, but to offer a transport service to the wider community. This creates another income stream and further protects Brooks Hire by diversification.

This year, we've taken delivery of two Volvo FH540 6x4 Prime Movers (Globetrotter Sleeper Cabs), and we have another one of these on order which is due to arrive over the coming months.

There's been a lot of positive feedback on the new trucks and we're already picking up external transport jobs.

Currently we have 10 machines at our Mackay branch including a brand new Volvo L220H Tool Handler, three Komatsu excavators, a Komatsu 30t artic. dump truck, Komatsu WA500 wheel loader, Cat 16' grader, Cat tracked skid steer, 14Kl water truck and a tipper truck. We will continue to grow our fleet in Mackay as machines are required.

Mackay is Brooks Hire's 14th branch in Australia, and fourth branch in Queensland. This branch will be used as a hub for the Central Queensland mining industry.

Some exciting news from the IT Department, Brooks Hire are in the process of creating our own custom fleet tracker - Brosat. By consolidating, KomTrax, My Cat and TAVL and others, Brosat will become a one stop portal for managing our entire fleet.

Features will include:

- Update Fleet usage hours directly into Greentree allowing predictive, preventative maintenance options.
- Easy view of Fault codes.
- Geo Fencing notifications.
- Mobile App available.
- Parts Tracking is also being tested with portable tracker that can be included in parts shipping.
- Future Customer interface for clients to view their hire equipment's location and usage.



In other IT news, after many years with Addax we have decided to move our Greentree support provider to Star. Star has over 40 employees nationwide and has been involved with Greentree development since the beginning. Star employ fulltime Greentree developers and we can expect timely and attentive support to our key business system.

The dispatch/receivable phone app is still in development, we are looking to roll this out nationally. If you have not been setup yet, please contact Scott, our IT Manager, regarding the procedure. We have been using the new system in Canning Vale for several weeks, vastly speeding up the dispatch/receivable process. The high-resolution photos with plant code, location and date stamp have made it a very effective tool for showing quality, zoomable before and after photos of machinery, which is imperative for on charging damages, missing items, GET etc.







This is a delicious Italian pasta recipe with a few simple ingredients just great for a busy working Mum or Dad.



Spicy Spaghetti With German Cheese Kransky

Ingredients

1 pack Aldi German Style Cheese Kransky – sliced diagonally

400g Thin spaghetti

Salt

Olive oil

Garlic cloves, diced

Flat-leaf parsley – roughly chopped

Chilli flakes

Black pepper

Parmesan cheese – grated

Instructions

- 1. Cook the spaghetti in a large saucepan of salted water according to the packet instructions. (approximately 8 mins)
- 2. Now, heat 10ml of olive oil and pan-fried the cheese kransky till brown, set aside.
- **3.** About half way before the pasta is ready, add the rest of the olive oil into the frying pan, add garlic and chilli flakes.
